12 Decades To Redemption

On the 11th of Nissan in the year 5662 (1902), Rabbi Levi Yitzchak and Rebbetzin Chana Schneersohn welcomed their oldest son Menachem Mendel into the world. From childhood on, he was fascinated by a unique vision: “From the time that I was a child attending cheder and even prior” wrote the Rebbe in a 1956 letter, “a vision of the future Redemption began to take form in my mind.”

In 5711 (1951), the Rebbe formally accepted the role of the seventh Chabad Rebbe. The same childhood vision was and remains the driving force behind the Rebbe’s “Mitzvah campaigns” and the army of shluchim spanning the globe, collectively making the world a place where G-d can feel at home.

In 5752 (1991), quoting several Torah sources speaking of the existence of a Jewish leader in every generation worthy of redeeming the Jewish people, the Rebbe declared that this individual has been given the Divine mandate to set the Redemption process into motion. The mission of every Jew is to be aware and make others aware of this, so we can stand ready to greet him. Studying the halachic description for Moshiach, one sees how the Rebbe’s modus-operandi follows exactly that description.

As we celebrate 120 years since the world was gifted with the Rebbe, join Chabad of Flatbush to become a stakeholder in the Rebbe’s vision for a better, more G-dly world and make it happen a moment sooner.
