



Moshiach & the High Holidays

Rosh Hashana:

On Rosh Hashanah we ask G-d to rule over us and make His sovereignty known over the entire world. Moshiach will accomplish this in the ultimate way by building the Holy Temple and bringing all of mankind to acknowledge G-d.

Yom Kippur:

On Yom Kippur, we act like spiritual beings by focusing on the knowledge that G-d is the only reality in our universe. It is this reality that will become apparent with Moshiach's arrival,

as the prophet Isaiah states: "The world will be filled with the knowledge of G-d as waters fill and cover the seas".

Sukkot:

During our daily prayers, we ask G-d: "Spread Your Sukkah of peace over us." This refers to a revelation of G-dly light that Moshiach will reveal, which in turn, will unite all of mankind under G-d's 'Sukkah' of sovereignty.

Shemini Atzeret-Simchat Torah:

According to our sages, joy enables a person to go beyond his or her own sense of self. Moshiach will bring that true joy and selflessness to the entire world!

Pidyon Kaporot

It is customary on the eve of Yom Kippur (or during the days between Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur) to take a chicken for "Kaporot", to atone for our sins. If one cannot do the Kaporot with a chicken, it can do so with money, and give it to Tzedaka (=charity). Please use the enclosed envelope to send us your support.

Monday, Sep. 16*: after 7:44
Holiday ends, Sep. 17: 7:42

Laws & Customs:

- ✓ Attend High Holiday Services.
- ✓ Hear the sound of the *Shofar* (on Sunday)

**Estimated Shofar blowing time
at the Chabad House: 1pm & 6:00pm**
(To request a Shofar blowing at your home, please contact us)



- ✓ Eat a festive meal.

- ✓ TASHLICH (sunday) - symbolically "cast out" your sins into the water.



Other traditions include:

- ✓ Greet one another on the first night of *Rosh Hashanah* with:

"L'shana tova tikatev v'tichatem"

(=May you be inscribed and sealed for a good year!).

- ✓ Enjoy an apple dipped in honey:

Before eating it, we make the blessing ha'etz over the apple and then add:

Ye-hi ratzon she-ti-cha-desh alei-nu shanah tovah u-m'tu-kah.

"May it be Your will to renew for us a good and sweet year."



- ✗ No eating or drinking for the entire duration of the fast.
- ✗ No wearing leather shoes.
- ✗ No washing any part of your body.
- ✗ No marital relations.

* Light from a pre-existing flame.

Yom Kippur

September 24 - 25

Times:

Candle Lighting/Fast Begins:6:32
Holiday/Fast Ends:7:29

Laws & Customs:

Before Yom Kippur:

- ✓ Perform the ancient custom of *Kaparat*.
- ✓ Eat and drink heartily on the day before Yom Kippur (Sunday, Sep. 24), It is a *Mitzvah!*

On Yom Kippur:

- ✓ Attend Synagogue.
- ✓ Recite *Yizkor* (Prayer of Remembrance).
- **Approx. 1:30pm at the Chabad House.**

- ✓ Attend the *Neilah* service
- The climax of the holiest day of the year. The gates of heaven, which were open all day, will now be closed—with us on the inside. Followed by a blast of the *Shofar* and the joyous proclamation, "Next Year in Jerusalem!"

Sukkot

September 29 - October 8

Times

Candle Lighting:
Friday, Sep. 29:6:24
Shabbos, Sep. 30*:after 7:20
Holiday Ends, Oct 1: 7:19



Laws & Customs:

- ✓ Eat & drink in a *Sukkah*.
- ✓ Make a blessing on the *Lulav & Etrog* (four species), every day except *Shabbat*.
- ✓ Attend Synagogue for the special Holiday services.
- ✓ Be happy and rejoice.

Shemini Atzeret - Simchat Torah

October 6 - 8

Times

Candle Lighting:
Friday, Oct. 6:6:12
Shabbos, Oct. 7*: after 7:09
Holiday Ends, Oct 8:7:07

Laws & Customs:

- ✓ Attend Synagogue.
- ✓ Dance *Hakafot* with the *Torah*.
-Hakafot: Sunday & Monday nights approx 7:15pm, & Tuesday morning approx 11:30
- ✓ Recite *Yizkor* (Oct. 7)
-**Approx. 12:30 pm at the Chabad House.**
